### **Chelmsford Civic Society Annual General Meeting**

Sir Simon Burns MP

Report and Accounts 2016 – 2017

7.30 pm Quaker Meeting House, Rainsford Road

Sir Simon has announced that he will be retiring from Parliament at the next General Election. He has been Conservative Member of Parliament for Chelmsford (West Chelmsford 1997 – 2010) since 1987. This will be an opportunity to hear Sir Simon reflect on his 30 years representing the people of Chelmsford at Westminster. He has served in the Coalition Government from May 2010 to September 2012 as Minister of State for Health Services and the between September 2012 and October 2013 as Minister of State for Transport. There have been six Prime Ministers since he entered Parliament, starting with Lady Thatcher.

### **Chelmsford in the Second World War: Andy Begent**

On February 21, war historian and author of the book *Chelmsford at War*, Andy Begent, will give a talk about Chelmsford and the people who lost their lives during the Second World War.

### **6 April 2017: The Building of High Chelmer and the Town Centre**

The opening of the Bond Street development has transformed the retail sector in Chelmsford. It has also changed markedly the look of the city centre. The last time change occurred on this scale here started with the publication of the detailed plans in 1968 and demolitions related to phase 1 of the redevelopment the following year. Dr James Bettley will take us back to those days in his talk on 'The Building of High Chelmer and the Town Centre' at 7.30 pm in the Quaker Meeting House on Rainsford Road, Thursday 6<sup>th</sup> April. Mick McDonagh, current Manager of the High Chelmer Centre, will take the Chair.

## **Marconi News/Events**

On **February 14<sup>th</sup> 2017**, marks the 95th anniversary of the start of Britain's first ever regular, advertised broadcast radio station, 2MT, which came live from Writtle in Essex. To commemorate this anniversary, and to celebrate the young, pioneering team of engineers, the Chelmsford Amateur Radio Society will be transmitting from the same building from where the original broadcasts commenced. One of their members, John Salmon, will also be operating a three-day internet radio service, Radio Emma Toc, featuring radio related documentaries, vintage comedies and live

programs from various locations. A special event call sign, GB95 2MT will be used to mark this occasion.

On **April 20<sup>th</sup> 2017**, there will be a Special Marconi Walk @10.30 - starting from Hall St -the world first wireless factory - through the history of the high street at the time to the New St factory where Benefit Cosmetics have invited us inside the 1912 building for a brief visit.
